I did manage to get some photos of this and if you are not specifically looking for the ripples on the water, you could not tell which image was the real thing. In just a few days I will be on a cruise ship in the Gulf of Alaska, God willing. God has blessed me to be a part of a mission group to Anchorage to work on a church - finishing up on construction and also landscaping. To take advantage of the trip, most of us are traveling a couple of days early to go visiting and site seeing in the area. That includes a one day

cruise from Seward to the Kenai Fjords area with its glaciers.

I have been on the riverboats of Savannah and New Orleans but never anything as large as a cruise ship. There is one thing common with all of them though - if you keep the water out, they will stay afloat. To make sure water stays out these ships have bilge pumps to pump any stray water back. Barring a huge crack in the hull, the

bilge pump should handle what comes over the rail or through a small crack. If the pump fails or no one turns it on, then the water continues to accumulate until the weight inside is too much for the ship to carry and it begins to sink.

As I thought of the cruise, I thought about how sin gets into our lives. Very seldom do we just open our soul and invite Satan in full force. *That's it. Our inner "self" doesn't want to dump God entirely, just keep Him at a comfortable distance. Three dollars of Him is sufficient. A sack full, nothing more. Just*

*enough to keep my guilt level below the threshold of pain; just enough to guarantee escape from eternal flames. But certainly not enough to make me nervous - to start pushing around my prejudices or nit-picking at my lifestyle. Enough is enough!*

Our commitment should stand the test when God begins to make demands on us. It is He who sustains us.

**Col 1:17-18 -- And He is before all things, and in Him all things consist. 18 And He is the head of the body, the church, who is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that in all things He may have the preeminence.**

Alaska is a beautiful, rugged country with most of the habitation on the southern coast and the panhandle. Alaska only has 600,000 people and Anchorage has 260,000 of them. Their highway system only goes to Hwy 9. If you want to go above Fairbanks or out to the west, you have to take a small charter plane or dog sled. Alaska has more privately owned planes and more pilots than any other state in the union. Hood Lake in Anchorage, located next to the airport, is the busiest float plane lake in the world with 804 flights in or out per day.

One of the big winter events in Alaska is the Iditarod Dog Sled race. There is a plaque statue on 4<sup>th</sup> Street in Anchorage that marks the spot where the race starts. This was once a 1,000 mile mail run from Anchorage to Nome and is still a route if one wants to make it by dog sled or snowmobile in the winter.

It is hard for me to realize there is an area of our country that has this much wilderness. I am used to a paved road at every block and even the dirt roads are graveled and two-way. If I want to jump in my truck and travel

to Georgia or far away, there is a super highway. Not so in Alaska.

I try to imagine what it was like during the time of Christ when transportation was two good feet or a donkey. Far countries might be on the shipping routes if one could afford passage. As far as I can tell, Jesus only rode twice in His life on land - the trip to Egypt and the ride into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday. This did not deter Him from being about the Father's business. Other than a couple of boat rides across the Sea of Galilee Jesus walked everywhere He went.

I realize we have to have better transportation today since the world is more populated and we have to do business around the world in a hurry. But how much do I have to hurry where I am? Will I walk around the block to invite a new arrival to church? Am I willing to walk an area in a new subdivision to share the Gospel with others? Can I put aside my want of comfort to make sure the Father's business is carried out? What am I doing with the talent God gave me? I do not want to hear Him say:

**Matt 25:28 - So take the talent from him, and give it to him who has ten talents.**

Ask yourself, "Am I personally in the will of God in my life?" If my answer is no, I must make changes before I can ask for anyone else. Then I must ask; "Will it glorify the Father in the Son?"

John 14: 13-14... And whatsoever ye shall ask in my name, that will I do, that the Father may be glorified in the Son. If ye shall ask any thing in my name, I will do it.

Betrayed by the people He came to visit, beaten beyond recognition, deprived of sleep or rest all night, whipped, loss of blood, body shock, and now nailed to the cross with the last moments of His life in sight, Jesus was at His weakest physically. At this moment, Satan works his deception and trickery because he believes NOW is the "opportune time." Not openly this time

because he knows there is still some fight in Christ. First, he uses the religious leaders who tempted, "He saved others, let Him save Himself IF He is the Christ." When Jesus would not rise to the challenge and ignored their taunts, Satan moved to the men on the adjacent crosses. One challenged "If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself".
